TPR/Confirmation Bootcamp

Our Thesis Proposal Review/Confirmation of Candidature boot camp is a three day 'deep dive' designed to help you finish writing your Thesis Proposal Review document and start putting together your presentation.

The TPR/Confirmation is the first and most important part of the ANU milestone process for HDR candidates. While the length of the document you have to write varies according to where you are enrolled, the basic format remains the same. The document should set out a clear research problem, situate your research proposal in the literature and tell the audience how you plan to carry out the research. The days will be quite long - from 9:30am to 4:00pm. Each day will feature a mix of short instructional workshops and time to write and think.

By the end of this boot camp you will have drafted key parts of your Confirmation documentation - and have a solid plan to finish it by the deadline!
