The start of June marks the beginning of Winter in Canberra. There has already been some snow up in the mountains so hopefully it keeps up for all of our keen skiers.

You will all have seen the release of the <u>Nixon Review Report</u>. This is a damning account of behaviour in our university that has impacted HDR candidates, and failures of our people and systems to deal with complaints and bad behaviour. I have been tasked with providing a plan to respond to recommendation 11 in the report. An update on actions will be provided in OnCampus on the 1st of July.

The university is currently reviewing how we best support HDR candidates with their academic writing. As part of this process, individual consultations will no longer be offered through the library from end of June, 2025. We understand this change may be disappointing and appreciate your patience as we explore new ways to meet the diverse writing needs of our research community.

The Student Administration System, formerly known as ISIS, has been upgraded and is now live as <u>ANUHub</u>. Please use the <u>guide</u> to navigate the new platform, or for additional support contact <u>Student Central</u>.

Thank you to everyone who completed the PRES survey. The results will assist us in addressing concerns or issues and supporting what already works well.

The ANU has been invited to nominate up to 5 participants in the prestigious <u>Global Young Scientists Summit (GYSS)</u> 2026. The Summit offers a series of activities, including live plenary lectures, panel discussions, Q&A sessions, and networking platforms. Participants will also stand a chance to be part of small group informal sessions with their pre-selected speaker(s), present their research on stage or through poster sessions, and visit institutes of higher learning and other prominent landmarks in Singapore.

Selection Criteria to apply:

- Show a genuine interest in science and research.
- Show a strong commitment to their principal field of study and to interdisciplinary work.
- Received the endorsement of an organisation that was invited to provide nominees (i.e. nominated through ANU).
- Be fluent in English to actively participate in discussions.
- Not have participated on-site in previous GYSS, with the exception for GYSS 2021 and 2022 (online editions).
- Not have a permanent position (in general, scientists with permanent positions).

The GYSS Committee will cover the cost of local hotel accommodation (for overseas-based participants), transportation between hotel and Summit venue and some catered meals.

Participants will need to arrange their own flights. Please considered apply for the <u>Vice-Chancellor's HDR Travel Grant</u>, if eligible.

Please email applications to the **Graduate Research Office**:

- One page addressing selection criteria above.
- CV (should highlight research interests, education background, awards and key publications).
- Letter of Support from a supervisor or head of school. Students enrolled in a coursework program must have their letter from the Associate Dean or College Dean endorsing the application.
