Graduate Research School

The Graduate Research School will consolidate all the service delivery and support related to your PhD or MPhil in a dedicated team. It will be established beginning in October as part of the Research and Innovation Portfolio change plan implementation, but has been a goal of the ANU PhD Strategy over the past several years.

Why are we doing this?

The federated structure of the ANU has meant multiple layers and processes in the way HDR candidature is managed. Establishing a single consistent team working together on the common administrative and training aspects of your degree aims to reduce administrative burden on you and your supervisors while also allowing for the unique local research experience.

HDR Administrative support staff in Colleges and Schools combined with the Graduate Research Office staff will make up this team. There will still be staff located in the same places for now and they will continue to support you. The

Graduate Research School also includes the Researcher Development Team, who will continue their excellent training program to support your research skills training.

Over the next several months, the Graduate Research School staff will work together to collectively review all administrative processes supporting you as HDR candidates, to work towards clarity and equity across ANU. In the coming months I will be holding town halls to answer any questions and you have about the transition to this new state. For now you will continue to seek and receive support in the same way you always have.

HDR Candidature Lifecycle project

As part of the ANU Digital Plan, the Research Stream within Information Technology Services (ITS) is leading an initiative to enhance your experience as a Higher Degree by Research (HDR) candidate at ANU.

This initiative focuses on streamlining digital administrative processes by transitioning HDR-related eForm workflows into a new solution delivering a more efficient, user-friendly digital experience. The project has been in train for some time and we are now preparing to test the new solutions that replace the current eForms. We will soon be seeking your assistance to test the new system.
