New HDR Leave of Absence Request launching 9 December

We're introducing a new Leave of Absence request process in ANUHub from Tuesday, 9 December. This change is designed to make things simpler and give you better visibility of your requests.

What's New?

- Submit your Leave of Absence request directly in ANUHub via a new button no more eForms. This includes requests for retrospective leave.
- Respond to any information requests within the system (instead of email).
- See personalised messages and warnings as you complete your request.

- Improved visibility of submitted requests.
- Requests will automatically go to the correct Delegated Authority for approval.

What You Need to Do

- From 9 December, submit new Leave of Absence requests via a new button in ANUHub. This includes requests for retrospective leave.
- From 9 December, action your return from leave via a new Return from Leave button in ANUHub.
- Keep an eye on your email and the Graduate Research School SharePoint Hub for updates and guides.
