

Alternative options for allowing resubmissions of Turnitin Assignments

Purpose:

These procedures provide guidance for lecturers or course conveners on alternative options for allowing resubmissions of Turnitin Assignments after the submission due date has passed.

Issue: As Turnitin assignment does not allow individual due date extension, if students have submitted before the due date, they are not able to resubmit after the due date, even if they have been granted an extension.

Procedures:

Outlined below are two alternate options that can be implemented by lecturers.

1. Lecturer can change the due date to a later date	 A. The due date is changed B. The student uploads the paper and submits it C. The lecturer then changes the due date back to the original date after the submission has been made How to update the due date: Go to the Turnitin assignment page Click on the pencil icon and editing the Due date to a later date. After the student submission, click the pencil icon to change the due date back. 					Implications: This affects the whole class, all students will be given the extension to resubmit.
